Reflections on the Cedar Falls Bible Conference's 100th Anniversary



Age has some advantages! It's why I'm getting to share. with you my thoughts about all the years I have been a participant at the Cedar Falls Bible Conference. The committee needed someone who had been there most of those years. Somehow my name was suggested. It must be since I've been around quite a long time, 98 years to be exact! I am grateful God has given me this opportunity to reflect on the bountiful blessing of being part of these conferences for many, many years. The Lord willing, I hope to be present with you to celebrate this "special" 100 year anniversary.

As a young child, I always heard my parents talking about the Cedar Falls Bible Conference. And as I grew older, I was actually privileged to attend with them.

The years unfolded rapidly; high school, college, teaching school and marriage to John Frey. He followed God's call on his life by going to seminary to become a

pastor, and thus began our life together of full time ministry. After our marriage, John and I decided to make the Bible Conference a priority. We both made the effort to keep one week open in late July to attend the Conference. It was always a blessed week of growing on Christ. Many speakers encouraged us to read our Bible, pray every day and be a light for Jesus. The speakers' names are too many to mention, let alone remember. The music, morning prayer meetings, youth and children's programs and all the day's activities were used to lead us to grow in our faith.

My reflections also go immediately to the Spirit-filled messages that impacted my life in Christ so much. And 'lest we forget', I must mention the wonderful 'Brats and Sweet Corn Night', the 'Pie and Ice Cream Night', and the great fellowship 'Every Night'.

There are two momentous memories that will always stand out for me. The first is when my husband, John, went to his heavenly home. My family and I were overwhelmed with prayer support that was showered upon us by our Bible Conference friends. An assembly of fellow Christians from the Bible Conference gathered together to lift us up! The power of prayer was demonstrated.

Then in 2006, I received a call from my granddaughter in Missouri, that her mother, my daughter, had suddenly died in her sleep. It was the second weekend of the 85th Bible Conference and again, the prayer that went out to my family was incredible! We felt God holding us in the palm of His hands, even though we were scattered all over, even to Austria. I recall feeling a deep desire for those present to make a commitment to Christ. One night following all

this, the speaker gave a Spirit-filled message and closed with an altar call. The call was for a first-time commitment to Christ or a recommitment of one's life. It was silent in the auditorium except for the beautiful organ-piano duet softly playing the familiar hymn, "I have decided to follow Jesus". While standing in front, someone placed a hand on my shoulder..." I felt the Holy Spirit through that hand give me a feeling of caring and blessing!"

Another memory points to the thread I'm sure you're seeing in what the Bible Conference brings to lives-namely supportive prayer, fellowship and spiritual growth. When we were planning to retire, we needed to make a decision...where? Through praying for many months, we had no answer. One morning, the speaker had a powerful message about prayer. He ended his message with this challenge... "Have you been praying about something and nothing has happened? Put feet to your prayers." He asked us to stand and pray sincerely for direction. As soon as John and I got in our car, he asked me, "What did you think of the speaker?" I quickly answered, "I think he was talking to us!" John agreed. We stopped at a gas station, looked for a telephone book, and called a realtor. We were shown 5 homes and by Saturday night, we had put in an offer on the home that I am still living in here in Cedar Falls. God does answer prayer!

Each Conference meant the renewal of friendships and making new ones. One afternoon was always dedicated to we pastors and spouses meeting to share what was happening in our churches and encourage each other with the speakers' messages. Every year we would say, "What a wonderful week it has been!" We were rejuvenated to go back to our own congregations with enthusiasm for our ministries.

I could go on and on, as you see, I already have! But I particularly want to give words of appreciation to all those who have been a part of the Bible Conference through the years. We, on the receiving end, are so grateful for the enthusiasm you bring and how you minister so faithfully again year after year! The Bible Conference legacy of meeting for 100 years is surely a Godly blessing!

The year was 1958. The camp was Youth Camp. It was a time when "yes" was "yes" and "no" was "no." A person's word was good and you could almost buy a car on the phone, because people knew your honesty. At that time, people were honest and straight as an arrow. It was a privilege to get to go to camp because money was scarce.

When we arrived, we were assigned a cabin to stay in with a counselor. A friend from church went with me. Our cabin was up near the cross, where we

had bonfires and sang, and had testimonies. The little chapel was across the lawn to the east. The train was awesome to hear at many times. The Tabernacle was a huge building with wooden window covers that could be put down when it rained. The birds were free to fly in and out. As I recall, there were pigeons among them. I remember the chairs being wooden folding chairs and wooden benches. The benches were without backs. The dining hall was a long building with long, wooden tables and benches. The food was wonderful. I remember the oven fried chicken and whipped potatoes; the smell of the food was a delight. It was served family style and no paper plates or glasses or silverware. What great cooks, the food was wonderful, and they were so faithful to the hard work. We ate what we took and we didn't throw anything away. I don't know where the ladies prepared the food. There were screens on the sides of the building to keep the flies out. We returned our dishes to the end of the building in an orderly fashion. Everyone was so kind.

Now I remember having met a young man from another church at the youth rally. He was the president of the Dubuque District. I remember having a crush on that young man. But he was about 45 miles from where I lived. However, he showed up at camp. He was a handsome hunk, oh ya!!!! I remember holding hands and walking with him when I got word that my sweet grandma passed away. I can tell you the very spot we were when I got the sad news. Grandma had a relationship with Jesus.

Another time, some guys and a counselor knew a girl in our cabin and decided to throw a bucket of water through the window...in her bedroom window. Scream, she did. Her screams were heard loud and clear. That cabin is no longer there. What fun we had. And time marches on.

A few years later, I married that handsome hunk, and we were camping in a tent with 2 children. We were camping near the shower and bathhouse. One of the children was still in diapers - not Pampers either. They were cloth. How times have changed. The ground was our changing table in the tent. I don't remember how many days we stayed. We tried to go every year. Many years

we could only attend in the evenings. Sometimes we stayed in the family cabin by then. Now, that was quite the setup. Kitchen, bathroom, shower. No young couple today with kids would even think of it for a week with in-laws and all. But we made fond memories and had a blessed time.

God was blessing our time set apart from the hectic world out there. We could definitely feel the presence of God at all times on the grounds. The grounds seemed like they were Holy grounds, then and now today. It is a special time to get away from the wild world out there, and just spend time with Jesus and His people.

As time rolled on, our kids married. Our oldest divorced and we were troubled about it. We drove to Cedar Falls and went to the grounds just to spend time in prayer and leave our burden there. We tried so hard to leave it there, but we would always seem to put in our basket and drag it along with us wherever we were. We learned we can't live our kids' lives for them. We have all made mistakes.

My mother-law passed away due to a car accident. And due to cancer and emphysema, my father too, went to be with Jesus. Then my mother and my father-in-law married. We had missionaries come back from the Ivory Coast. The lived in the cabin for a summer until they found something different. They too, found it so peaceful and serene as they were getting reacquainted with America.

Later, the cabin was given to a sister-in-law. My husband and a brick layer had the cabin lifted and they put brick under it. They changed the entire floor plan, new kitchen, bathroom, and bedrooms.
